

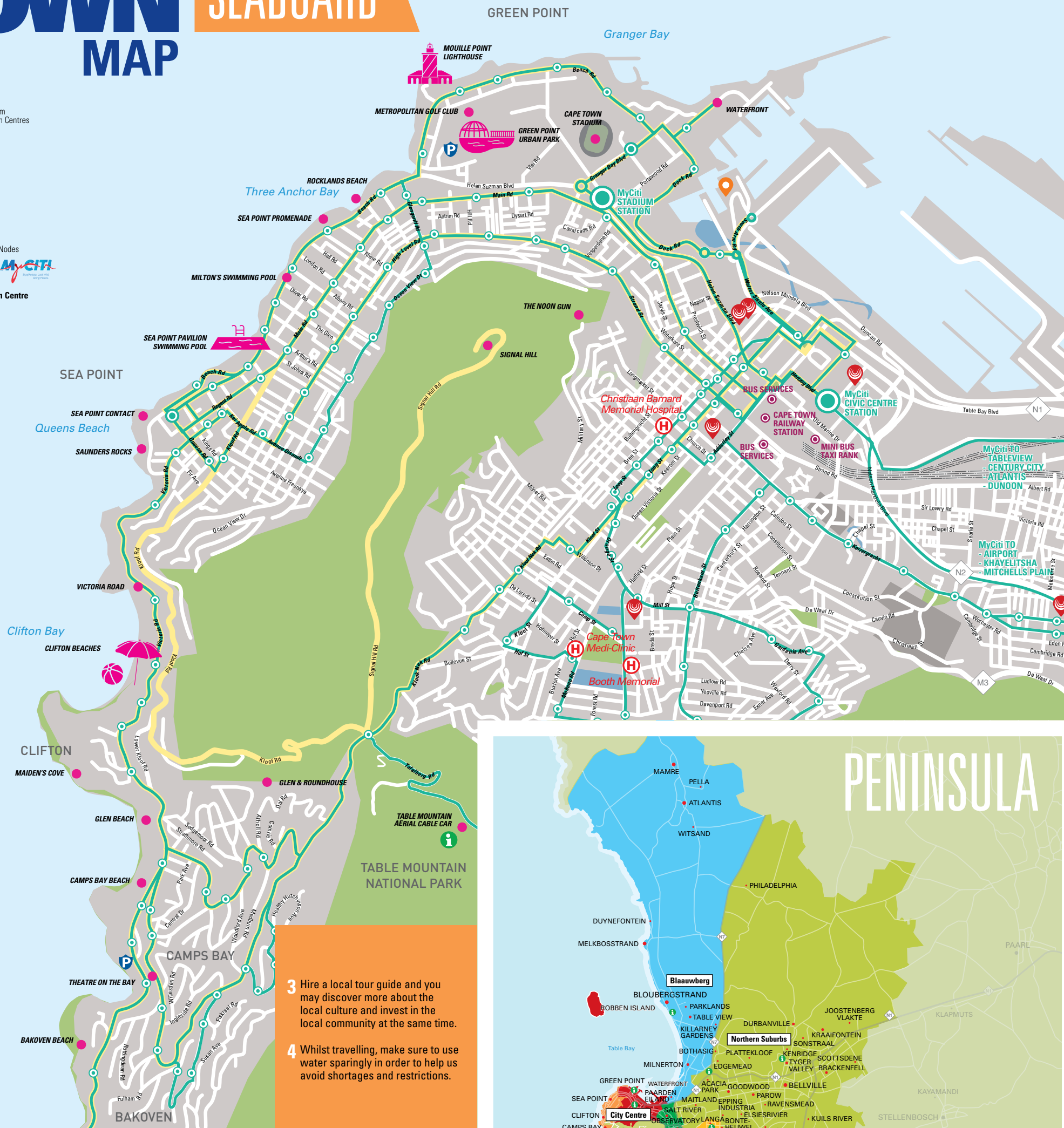

TOP 10 MUST-DO EXPERIENCES

- 1 Table Mountain:** Hike or take the cableway up one of the New7Wonders of the world.
- 2 V&A Waterfront:** Spend the day shopping, eating and relaxing at the most visited attraction in Africa.
- 3 Robben Island:** Visit the UNESCO World Heritage site where Nelson Mandela spent 27 years in prison.
- 4 City Walking Tour:** Discover the heritage, architecture and hidden gems of the CBD by using this map to navigate your way or book a tour guide.
- 5 Sea Point Promenade:** Join the locals as they run, walk, cycle and skateboard the 11km route parallel to the ocean.
- 6 Lion's Head:** Book out 2-3 hours and hike one of the greatest routes in the world by enjoying stunning 360 degree views.
- 7 Greenmarket Square:** Enjoy the African vibe, street cafés and arts and craft markets in the cobbled-stone square.
- 8 Long Street:** Party at one of the vibrant clubs or restaurants at night or browse the many quirky shops during the day.
- 9 Camps Bay:** Have a lazy day on the Blue Flag graded beach or enjoy a cocktail on the famous sunbowner strip.
- 10 Bo-Kaap:** Take your picture at one of the colourful houses in this historic Cape Malay community.

- 3** Hire a local tour guide and you may discover more about the local culture and invest in the local community at the same time.
- 4** Whilst travelling, make sure to use water sparingly in order to help us avoid shortages and restrictions.
- 5** Try out the different local cuisines and you will taste new delicious dishes, but you will also be supporting the local community.
- 6** Do not miss out on the local craft markets because you can purchase beautiful, hand crafted souvenirs whilst supporting local businesses.

BE A RESPONSIBLE TRAVELLER

- 1** When driving or hiking, stick to the well-marked paths and roads and make sure to not remove any natural keepsakes such as shells or indigenous flowers.
