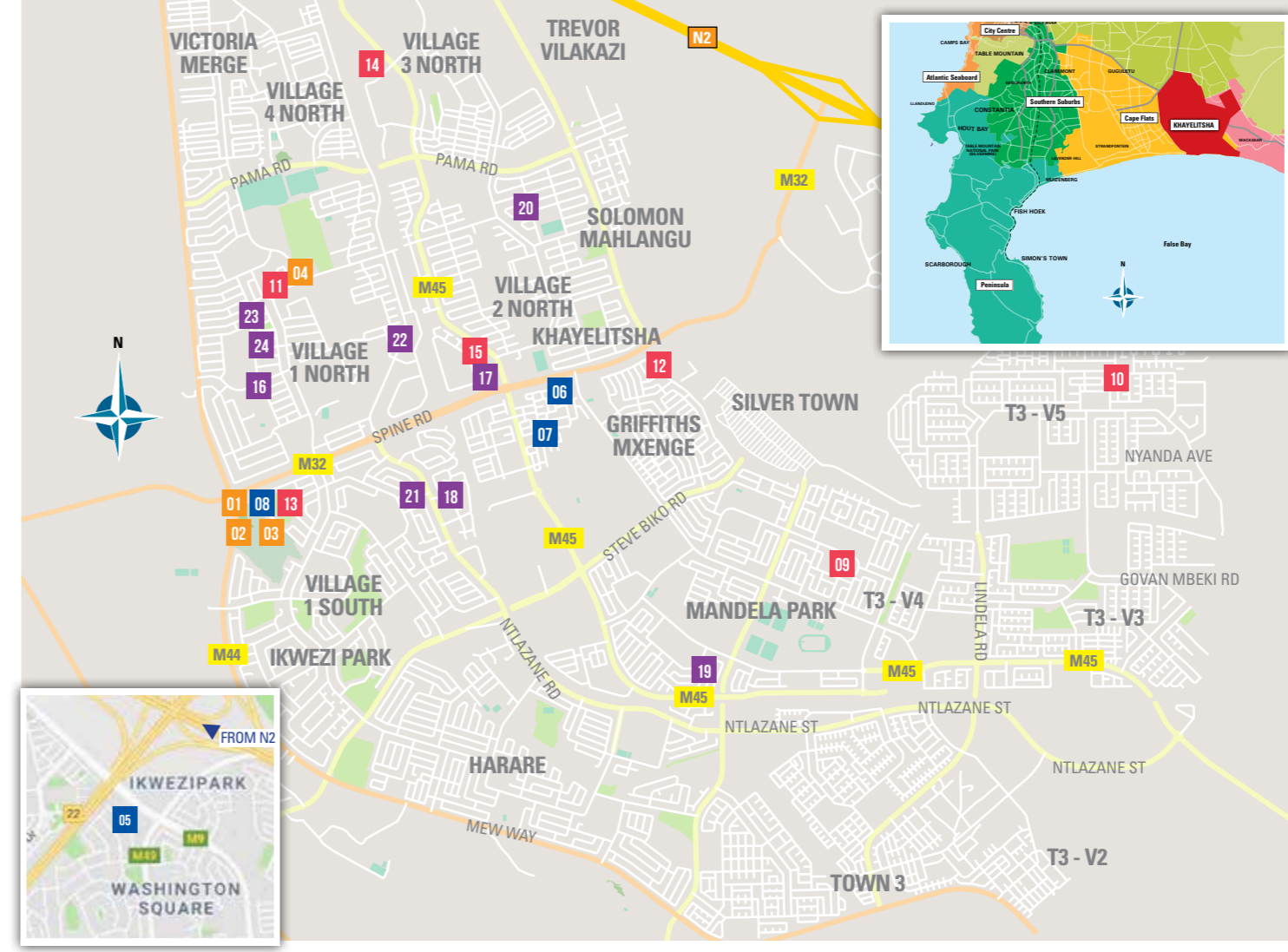

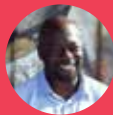

 - It was established in 1983 to house homeless Xhosa families on the Cape Flats.
 - IsiXhosa is the most spoken language at home.
 - It is reputed to be the largest and fastest growing township in Cape Town.
 - It is in an area of approximately 39km² (15m²).
 - Khayelitsha was also the first township on the Cape Flats to set up its own community radio station - Zibonele Community Radio – 98.2fm.
 - It is a vibrant township known for its entrepreneurial spirit and social development projects.
