V&A WATERFRONT

01 The V&A Waterfront is an iconic mixed-use destination located in the oldest working harbour in the Southern Hemisphere. With Table Mountain as its backdrop, the 123-hectare neighbourhood sits within the beautiful city of Cape Town, welcoming millions of people from all over the continent and the rest of the world.

The V&A is a symbol of heritage and diversity, where people from all walks of life can play, live, shop, dine and work while immersed in the vibrant spirit and authentic local culture that thrives in this bustling ecosystem. It sees its role on the continent to be a platform that facilitates and champions art and design, to support entrepreneurship and innovation, lead the charge on sustainability, and drive positive social and economic change.

By prioritising people and the planet, the V&A is an example of how working with communities, respecting the environment and operating with passion and integrity is a better, more productive and kinder way of doing business.

The V&A's 'Joy from Africa to the World' initiative is an example of this ethos as it symbolises the magic that happens when co-creating with the art, craft and design community. While primarily a Festive Season initiative, 'Joy from Africa to the World' is more than Christmas decorations. It is intended as a platform to celebrate the best of local design and hero the art and craftsmanship of creative individuals in diverse communities across the country and the continent. All materials are sustainably-sourced and all installations are handmade.



• The Nelson Mandela Gateway is the departure point for Robben Island, the world-famous World Heritage Site. Robben Island is a stark reminder of the apartheid system, and a symbol of the triumph of the human spirit over adversity, suffering and injustice. The maximum-security prison where Nelson Mandela was incarcerated, is now a museum where daily tours are conducted by ex-political prisoners. All ferries depart from Jetty 1, Nelson Mandela Gateway, Clock Tower precinct, V&A Waterfront. Once on the Island, visitors are transported by bus.

• The Watershed is where you meet Cape Town's design story. The Watershed is a beautiful and vibrant space where over 150 tenants offer more than 365 brands to visitors. These include ceramics, textiles, furniture, fashion and jewellery. Many of the traders sell unique products and arts and crafts. Exhibitions, live entertainment and workshops are also hosted here. The space plays a key role in the delivery of the V&A's strategic intent to provide a platform for small creative businesses to thrive.

• Art in Public Spaces provides you with an array of unexpected artworks, strategically placed throughout the Waterfront. There are the Rhinos are Coming - sculptures adding colour and promoting a great cause. The spectacular outdoor art exhibition is to raise awareness and to keep South Africa's rhinos from extinction through poaching.

Look out for sculptures chiselled, hand-carved, and polished by using an array of specialised equipment. The type of stones used come mostly from Zimbabwe and the Limpopo Province and they include serpentine black, fruit verdite, spring stone, opal, butter, and soap stone.

The sculptures ingeniously made from recycled materials will equally amaze and delight the eye.
